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



The Liturgical Season of Lent

After the end of Christmastide, we entered a few weeks of Ordinary Time before beginning the season of Lent, which began on Ash Wednesday (14th February 2024) and ends on Maundy Thursday (28th March 2024), the day before Good Friday. Lent is a time when the Church invites everyone to look carefully at their lives, to make Lenten promises and make a fresh start with God and with each other. Lent lasts for 40 days and the three 'pillars' of Lent are PRAYER, FASTING and ALMSGIVING.



FASTING:



PRAYER: Lent helps us to focus upon the precious gift of the Lord's Body and Blood, the Holy Eucharist and His many Sufferings and Death in His Sacred Passion.



ALMSGIVING. — During Lent, we will be GIVING to The Good Shepherd Appeal.

We were so lucky to have a visit from Kevin from Father Hudson's Care who spoke to the children about this charity. The Good Shepherd Appeal is a Lenten fund raising appeal run by Father Hudson's Care and is something we, at St Bernadette's, have supported for a number of years. Father Hudson's Care is the social care agency of the Catholic Archdiocese of Birmingham. They work in Oxfordshire, Staffordshire, Warwickshire, Worcestershire and the West Midlands to help people in need. The children have brought home a recyclable plastic money bag, we ask you to fill this with whatever you can afford. Perhaps the children could donate some of their sweet or treat money, or raise money in other ways. All the money raised will help to care for children, families and adults in need.




Sainsbury's You Argos

Attendance

Every minute counts

Frequent absence can add up to a considerable amount of lost learning and can seriously disadvantage your child in adult life.

- 5 minutes late every day means around 3 ½ days of education are missed.
- A score of 90% in a test would be a good result but 90% attendance means that a child will have missed around 100 lessons over a school year.

Attendance update

We continue to track attendance every week and work hard to ensure every child in school demonstrates good attendance and punctuality. If children are to reach their full potential they need to be in school every day, unless they are too unwell to attend. We will make home visits from time to time, particularly if we have safeguarding concerns or if a child's attendance is causing a concern. Even if a parent has called the school to give a reason for their child's absence, a home visit may still occur. We aim to offer both support and challenge where needed, but always have the child's best interest at heart.
