



#### St Anthony of Padua

On Friday 13<sup>th</sup> June, 6ZB will be celebrating their class saint. Born in Portugal in 1195 to a wealthy family, St Anthony felt called to the priesthood from a young age and chose a life of poverty. At 15, he began his studies in Lisbon and later joined the Franciscan order, changing his name to Anthony. While travelling to Morocco, he became seriously ill and was forced to return home. A storm diverted his ship to Sicily, where he was asked unexpectedly to preach. Inspired by the Holy Spirit, his powerful words left a lasting impression.

One day, his cherished book of sermons was stolen. After praying for its return, the thief not only brought it back but joined the Franciscan order—an event considered a miracle. Because of this, St Anthony is known as the patron saint of lost and stolen items. His feast day is celebrated on 13th June.

Due to a price increase from the dairy, we will no longer be offering paid milk from September 2025. However, children in Nursery and Reception will continue to receive a free, daily carton of milk as usual.

## June - The Month of the Sacred Heart

June is widely recognised as the month dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus primarily because the solemnity of the Sacred Heart is celebrated during this month. This year, the solemnity falls on 27<sup>th</sup> June, the 19<sup>th</sup> day after Pentecost (a Friday), and the Feast of the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary follows on the next day.






Both of these feasts use the heart as a symbol of love. The image of God's love is revealed in the pierced heart of His Son. It is the symbol of a love that conquers sin and transcends death, the symbol of the One who loved us to the end.

Love has always been associated with the heart, so it was only natural that the love of God became represented by a heart, the heart of His Son Jesus. In Him, God the Father revealed His infinite love for us.

"Open yourselves to this love and take it 'to the ends of the earth,' witnessing to the goodness and mercy that flow from the Heart of Jesus." – Pope Francis

## What can we learn from reflecting on the Sacred Heart?

Jesus wants us to know that we can come to Him and our true rest is when we rest in Him. *How do we do this?* Prayer is our daily fuel and Jesus never wants us to feel burdened. Embrace the virtues of Jesus. Choosing to embrace the virtue of humility, to put aside arrogance, and to be kind and open to others. Welcome the presence of the Heart of Christ, entrusting your home to Him. Before the open heart of Jesus, we seek to draw from Him the true Love that our families need. We turn to the Heart of Jesus for healing and know that His MOST wounded heart is the source of healing and hope for all. Every person matters; there is hope for everyone to be transformed by Love. Strive for virtue, not fame or wealth. Virtue is the backbone of our holiness, and often progress in this area is very slow. The goal is that we don't backslide. So what virtues are like the Heart of Jesus? All the Christian Virtues flow from His Heart, in particular faith, hope, and love.

## Vocations Day at St. Bernadette's

Every year, St. Bernadette's holds a special 'Vocations Day' to inspire and inform our children, helping them evaluate their purpose in life and think deeply about their future.



As a Catholic school, we believe the most significant calling we hear is from God. We are called to be holy, to follow God in our lives and to use our God-given gifts in our work. As St. John Henry Newman beautifully stated, *"God has created me to do Him some definite service; He has committed some work to me which He has not committed to another. I have my mission."*

# Attendance

## Every minute counts

Frequent absence can add up to a considerable amount of lost learning and can seriously disadvantage your child in adult life.

- 5 minutes late every day means around 3 days of education are missed.
- A score of 90% in a test would be a good result but 90% attendance means that a child will have missed around 100 lessons over a school year.

## Attendance update

We continue to track attendance every week and work hard to ensure every child in school demonstrates good attendance and punctuality. If children are to reach their full potential they need to be in school every day, unless they are too unwell to attend. We will make home visits from time to time, particularly if we have safeguarding concerns or if a child's attendance is causing a concern. Even if a parent has called the school to give a reason for their child's absence, a home visit may still occur. We aim to offer both support and challenge where needed, but always have the child's best interest at heart.

# Phonics Guidance for EYFS Parents

Monday 9<sup>th</sup> June 9-9.30AM-Infant Hall (Parents/Carers only)

If your child is currently in Nu**rsery** or **Reception**, they will be taking part in daily phonics lessons, following the Read Write Inc. Scheme.

Most of us were taught to read in different ways, leading to some confusion for our children when letter sounds are recited differently at home than they are taught at school.

It is really important that letter sounds are pronounced accurately in order to provide our children with the best possible start to their reading journey.

Please join me (Mrs Rainey) in a quick phonics session where I will be demonstrating ways in which you can further support your child. I will cover: -The correct pronunciation of letter sounds -Age Related Expectations
